## Hope for the Future

On an early summer morning, at Daphne’s Bayfront Park pier, brothers Brennan (right) and Cody (top) Carroll greet with a hug, smooth their dark brown hair from the breeze and peer into the camera. The

brothers aren’t models. They’re teenage boys who, until recently, failed in school and lived a life rife with alcohol and drugs.

The boys and their parents talk candidly about their struggles. Brennan’s drug abuse started at 12, Cody’s at 10. Both boys know the smell and feel of a concrete cell block. Parents, Daphne and Chris, married and divorced twice. They wrestled with their own substance abuse, losing jobs, money, their home and almost their children.

The Carroll’s credit youngest daughter Caitlin (left) and United Way of Baldwin County agency Outward Bound, a wilderness intervention for troubled teens and their families, with setting them straight. Caitlin renounced her family’s lifestyle and sought help from Outward Bound. In

a yearlong intervention, Outward Bound staff directed the Carroll’s to other United Way agencies who joined the effort to find the family a fresh start.

Today, drug-free, Daphne and Chris hold solid jobs. Caitlin welcomed an opportunity to live at Big Oak Girls Ranch in Springville, Cody started a new year at Robertsdale High and Brennan, a high school dropout, headed to college on scholarship.

“The United Way has given me hope. I have moved from dying in life to having a huge future,” said Brennan.
